## CALL FOR PAPERS

The IX Cultural Heritage Conference organised by La Ponte-Ecomuseu will take place on 19 May in Villanueva de Santu Adrianu (Asturias). On this occasion the conference will be entitled: "Building networks to create resilient communities".

The motivation for this meeting comes from understanding the human being as one of the species with the greatest capacity for collaboration. An ability to collaborate with other human beings in an altruistic and empathetic way. This anthropological quality of the "gift" was one of the cornerstones of ecomuseums and the New Museology, as well as one of the hallmarks of museology since the 1960s.

Nowadays, in the field of museology and heritage, it is not uncommon to find small projects, initiatives or processes in isolated places, not only in a geographical sense, but also in terms of their knowledge, methodologies and themes. These promoters/projects sometimes desperately seek support and points of reference beyond their own actions, with the logical objective of learning, self-assessing by comparison, borrowing knowledge, etc. But on many occasions it is difficult to find the means for this need to materialize. That is why we thought of creating a space specifically dedicated to the creation of knowledge and work networks during these conferences.

At the <u>VIII La Ponte-Ecomuséu Conference</u> the main idea was the search for resilient strategies to empower local communities. The debates and reflections went through, among other things, proposing to generate networks, consortiums and collaborative projects at a local and international level. It is time to discuss how these networks can be created, how to generate synergies between entities, where to look for them and how to strengthen links for the exchange of knowledge, ideas, projects, etc.

The intention of the new edition of the conference is to present initiatives, methodology and cases to identify the needs and/or difficulties of local communities to create this type of network. The ultimate goal is that this can give rise to European consortia or small regional networks, depending precisely on those needs and interests.
